

# Tigerton MS/HS Agriculture Department Happenings

It certainly has been a busy fall season in the Tigerton MS/HS Ag Department and FFA Chapter. Agriculture classes offered this year include: Forestry, Intro to Agriculture, Food Processing, Food Science, MS Rotation (9 week for grades 6-8), Agricultural Productions (SE), and Horticulture. Here are some happenings of the school year so far:

Over the summer, the department grew and harvested garden produce in the school garden and community garden spaces that were processed into products for the school lunch program and the F.R.E.S.H. table in front of Anita Haircut. Hopefully, two of the white Tower Gardens will be operational after Christmas break.

In September, the Food Science and Food Processing classes made tomato salsa for the school lunch program. Food Science learned about food preservation by making grape jelly and dried apples, baking skills through making pies from scratch, and a variety of Christmas cookies. They plan to learn about meats, cheesemaking, and dairy products in upcoming labs.

Food Processing students finished a unit on hunger and food insecurity issues and a food study of Christmas Around the World. They will also be learning about dangers of hidden sugars in our food, as well as a variety of food studies—sandwiches, pizzas, meats and sausage making, pasta, etc.

Forestry students learned about tree identification, forest fires, forest pests, and diseases, and will finish the semester with harvesting, re-production methods, and urban forestry.

Ag, Leadership, and U students (8th grade) had fun learning about the importance of the agricultural industry, ag career exploration, FFA opportunities, basic Parliamentary Procedure motions, as well as some food labs in fruit leather and ice cream. Third quarter will be the Exploring Ag 7 class, and end the year with the Environmental Science 6 class during fourth quarter.

Ag Productions (SE) is a science equivalent approved class through DPI for their third credit of science for graduation. Students have learned about ag history, soils, cells, genetics, and biotechnology and are currently learning about plants.

In October, Horticulture students picked concord grapes for my sister-in-law after learning about Plant Classification terms and Plant Anatomy. They've been studying the various types of growing media, plant nutrients, and growth, recently learning about floral design and made holiday wreaths to take home. After Christmas they will be learning about landscaping basics, pruning, plant reproduction, and the process of starting plant cuttings in preparation of the spring plant sale.

To raise money for their trip to the 95th National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, six members sold almost 100 fall mums in early October. Later, Jessica B., Bella G., Gabe D., Michaela G., Rae Ann S., Samantha S., and Ms. Rowe traveled with six other area schools on a charter bus and had a great time learning more about career opportunities in agriculture and the National FFA Organization. We toured a farm machinery manufacturer in Brodhead, WI, part of the ACES campus at University of Illinois-Urbana, a honey farm, and popcorn retailer in Indiana. This year, Courtney Zimmerman of the Spencer FFA, WI, served as Central Region Vice President. Her mom, Cheryl Zimmerman, served as interim National FFA Advisor.

Molly Brehm, a 2019 THS graduate, was a member of this year's National FFA Honors Chorus.

The FFA Chapter recently distributed 30 Operation Christmas Cheer bags in December to nominated people who recently lost loved ones, battling severe illnesses, and elderly. They also conducted their door to door fundraiser selling fresh fruit and nuts. There are extra nut tins available for sale ranging from \$7 to \$17. Contact Ms. Rowe @ 715-535-4026 if interested.

## Open Enrollment Information

Beginning February 6, 2023, parents of non-resident students may apply for Open Enrollment to the School District of Tigerton. Public School Open Enrollment is the program that allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live.

The program for the School District of Tigerton is open to students in 5 year-old kindergarten to grade 12. It also applies to 4 year-old kindergarten students provided the district of residence also operates that program.

The open enrollment application period for the 2023-2024 school year runs from February 6 through April 28, 2023. **The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 28, 2023. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.**

# PBIS at the Tigerton Elementary

At Tigerton Elementary, every student deserves a welcoming and supportive learning environment. Parents, students, and staff share responsibility for teaching positive behavior and developing good citizens. PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) aims to help students develop the self-discipline strategies they need to make good decisions. Our main goal is to acknowledge students for their consistently good behavior. We will stay on track and be expected to—Practice Respect, Accept Responsibility, Work Together, and Stay Safe.

The staff recognizes students who exhibit positive choices in the classroom and throughout the school day. When school expectations are followed, students are recognized for their efforts by receiving classroom tokens, such as: gems, stickers, or marbles. The class collects the tokens, and when students fill their jar or chart, the class earns a reward (extra recess, video, etc.).

On Monday, October 31, Tigerton Elementary held a PBIS Celebration Day. Our students celebrated being respectful, responsible, cooperative, and safe with an all-school unit. Students in grade Kindergarten through fifth attended. Students painted rocks, played Halloween Bingo, sang Halloween songs, built Lego creations, and learned a dance to perform for families after the Halloween Parade. Then students watched a movie together.

A PBIS Incentive Day was held on Friday, November 18. PBIS incentives are earned by displaying positive behavior. For the first incentive, the students were required to have a certain number of days (80%) in which they exhibited appropriate behavior (no behavior referrals). Students who qualified for the incentive watched a movie on a giant screen in the gym while snacking on popcorn and sipping water. Students enjoyed an ice cream treat after the movie. After exhibiting such good behavior in class, those students were due for a fun afternoon.

This fall, teachers and staff reinforced the following monthly themes: Back to school, respect, gratitude, and kindness. Students are now working towards earning a sledding celebration for the winter. The pictures are from our PBIS Halloween All-School Unit Celebration.
