When the TPAC was created in the Fall 2022 the goal was to make this space a “world class performing arts venue” for our community; after lots of hard work we are well on our way to reaching this goal. This spring the old wooden bleachers were removed and new (to us) seats were brought in. The new padded seats now adorn the room, and we can comfortably seat 140 audience members to any production. Also, graduated senior McKenzie Miller ‘23 painted an incredible mural outside of the TPAC welcoming all visitors to the space.

This spring, the space has been used for the Music Department's Jazz/Pops Concert, various High School ACP (Academic and Career Planning) presentations, the production of *Newsies, Jr.*, the senior awards night, the music and theater awards night, NHS (National Honors Society) induction, and most recently the eighth grade promotion ceremony. The events have utilized the newly installed high quality sound system, stage lights, and curtains.

This summer, the space has a few major projects occurring, including: painting the walls, relocating of the sound booth to include a scenic projection computer, and the updating of some stage lighting. The largest upgrade this

summer will be the installation of a high quality 7,000 lumen projection system with scrim for scenic projections, movies, or other events that require projection in the space. We look forward to continued updates of the space for the community.

Tigerton Solo & Ensemble State Festival Results

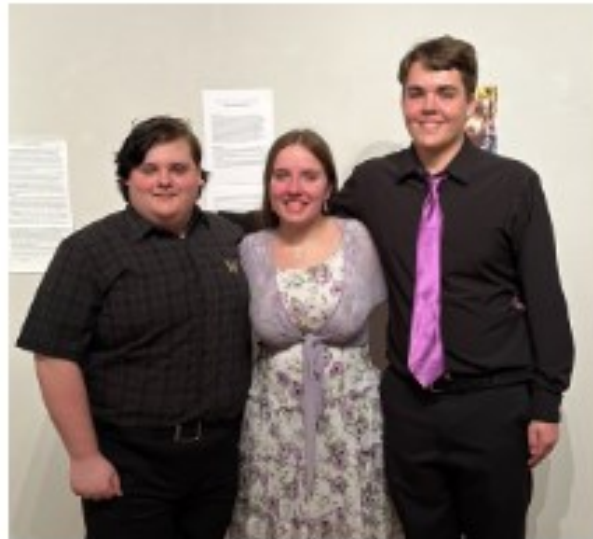

In order to prepare for the 2023-24 school year, here is some important information to help you and your athlete(s) be ready for the upcoming sport season(s). Prior to the FIRST DAY of PRACTICE your child(ren) will need to complete all the necessary athletic paperwork.

Your son or daughter will need the following items:

_____ **Physical Form**---filled out completely and turned in by the first day of practice to the Athletic Director or his/her coach. (A physical on file/taken after April 1, 2021, and/or during the 2021-22 school year is valid for the 2021-22 and 2022-23 school years. A new physical would be required for the 2023-24 school year.)

OR

_____ **Alternate Card**---filled out completely and turned in by the first day of practice to the Athletic Director or his/her coach. (A physical on file/taken after April 1, 2022, and/or during the 2022-23 school year is valid for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years. An alternate card can be used for the 2023-24 school year.)

The physical form or alternate card needs to be turned in BEFORE your son/daughter can practice with the team.

TIGERTON ATHLETICS–IMPACT TESTING

ImPACT testing must be done to participate in athletics in grades 6-12th in the Tigerton School District. This helps when an athlete is suspected of having a concussion.

ImPACT testing will take place at Tigerton High School, in Mr. Schmidt’s room, on the following dates. A testing session will start every hour during that time. If you come after the top of the hour, you will have to wait until the beginning of the next hour to take the test. Tests will take approximately an hour to complete.

CONSTRUCTION TRADES CAREER FAIR

Mr. Schmidt, Tech Ed teacher, took 15 students (mostly in Tech Ed classes) to the construction trades career fair at Blackwell Job Corps near Laona, Wisconsin, on Tuesday, April 25. This was an interactive, hands-on fair for young adults interested in exploring a career in related trade industries.

The students had the opportunity to meet and learn from journeypersons and employers in all trade areas while they tried various hands-on daily work activities. The trades people made the students aware of the apprenticeship opportunities that are currently available. The trades are booming, and they are all looking for skilled workers that the companies are willing to train.

Mr. Schmidt said that the students represented the Tigerton District very well and many stepped out of their comfort zone and tried things they may never have the opportunity to do again. “I feel like the students got a lot out of this fair, and I was impressed at many of their skills.”

Some of the hands on included:

Welding—virtual welding

Building Construction —steel walls, drywall hanging, and nail hitting

Concrete and Masonry—brick laying, tile hanging, and tile cutting

Electrical—wiring up a switch and light and conduit bending

HVAC—duct work building and welding as well as system setups

The last stop was in the gymnasium where there were many booths set up for the students to visit regarding different after high school options. This was a well organized event, and I hope to take more students in the future.

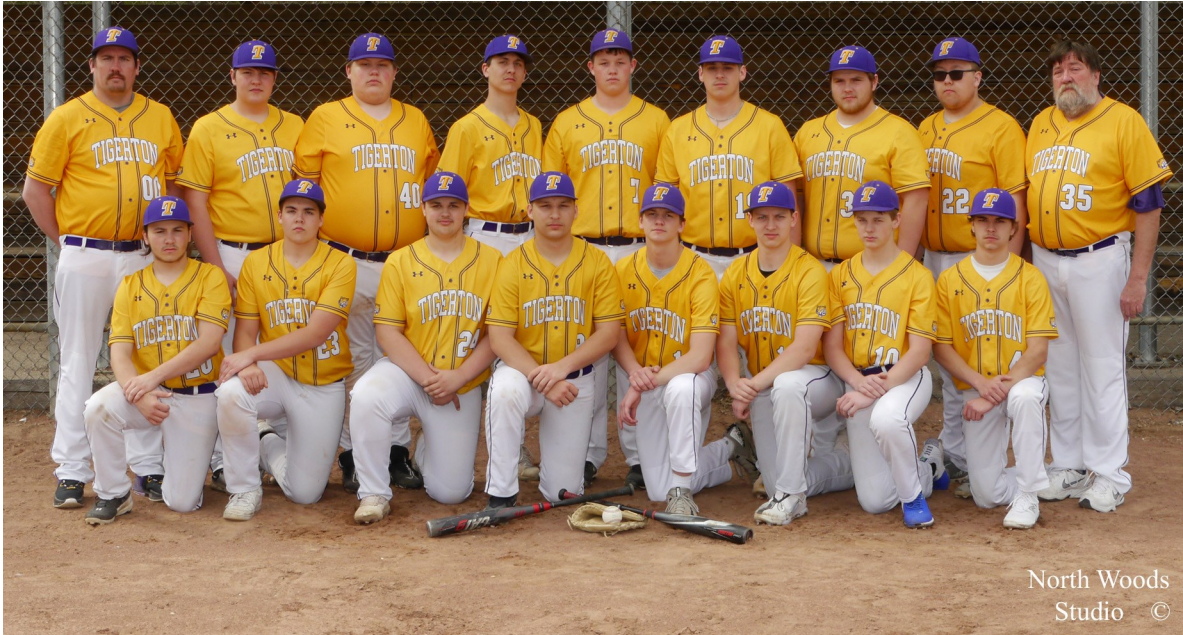

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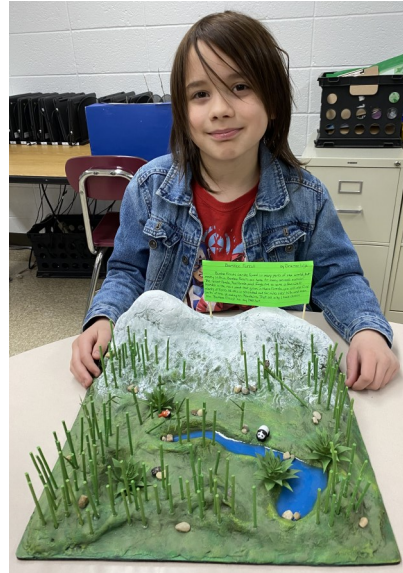


Explore the Wonders of Habitats
